

2016 National Convention News

Dear AGO Chapter and Friends:

We are thrilled to share our new convention logo with you! The Promotion Committee presented the logo to the Steering Committee at the May meeting, and the design was met with applause and unanimously approved. Kudos to Carol Nave and her committee for their outstanding work. Carol described the committee's desire to create a logo that was unique, adaptable, appropriate and timeless. The vibrant green color pallet and the



suggestive pipe display creates a fresh logo that will look great in advertising, on name tags and music bags, and clothing articles. The emblem also works well in black and white. Look for this logo to be prominently displayed for years to come!

The Program Book Committee is considering using both an electronic version of the program book, as well as a smaller hard copy of basic convention information. Andrew Bowen demonstrated the many features of an electronic convention book that would integrate all convention elements. The smaller convention book would still include the basics everyone needs. Houston will be launching the AGO forward, *setting a new benchmark for future conventions!* (Remember this phrase from our vision statement?!)

Our final presentation at the May Steering Committee meeting was the roster of performers presented by the Performance Committee. Linda Thomas, Interim Chair serving while Robert Bates has been on sabbatical), offered a brief history of the committee's work. She noted that the committee started with 82 names, and many factors were considered in achieving the outstanding line-up of performers. The performer roster was approved unanimously and with great enthusiasm. We will be able to share the roster, venues and schedule with you after the National Council approves our selections in October. Stay tuned!

Your convention committees are working very hard, giving countless volunteer hours to serve the world of organs, music and musicians. Convention committees are intentionally small to facilitate ease in effective teamwork, but some of the committee goals can only be accomplished with additional assistance from Chapter members. Occasionally, our convention committees will need friends like you to staff special task-force groups.

- A task-force is a small group dedicated to completing a specific task for a committee
- Members of a task-force work for a specific amount of time on one task until it
 is complete. They are not designated committee members, but within the specific timeframe, operate under the leadership of the committee.
- When the task is completed, the task-force is dissolved.
- A person may be on more than one task-force if their schedule allows.

If you are interested in working on a task-force in the future, please send Ann Frohbieter, Ralph Tamper or me a note. We will add your name to a list of task-force volunteers that we will distribute to our committee chairs. Offering to help does not oblige you to accept when called, but does require your commitment to see the task through if you agree to help.

Thanks for your continued support! This convention is hosted by all of us – not just the few on committees. Success depends on each one of us offering our time and giving our best to this historic Houston event!
